

Fresh As A Daisy

Materials Required:

Quilling paper: 10mm White x 1, 3mm Green x 1, 1.5mm Yellow x 1 and Green x 2.

Quilling tool and Antique pattern scissors.

Recycled patterned (inside) envelope.

White card 10cm x 15cm.

Card to match mount 4.5cm x 7cm.

Hole punch.

P.V.A. Craft Adhesive.

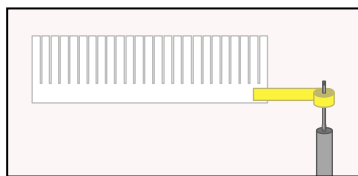
Card mount: SF03U (colour to match envelope).

To Make The Card:

I have used card cut to size instead of a ready made card as the colour was a perfect match with my envelope patterns, the card colours are Vanguard Cerise and Deep Blue.



To make the Daisy head, finely fringe a one third length of white 10mm paper, glue it to the end of a quarter length of 1.5mm yellow. Starting with the yellow end, roll up tightly onto the quilling tool and glue the end so that it does not unroll. Carefully remove it from the tool and bend the daisy petals out to make the flower head.



For the bud, finely fringe a one eighth length of white 10mm paper, roll tightly and glue the

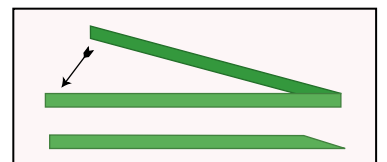
Cut a rectangle in white with the antique scissors approx. 8cm x 12cm, glue onto the card. Cut a rectangle approx. 6cm x 9cm from the patterned envelope and glue into place. Glue the small piece of matching card to the centre of this.

To make the



end so it does not unroll. Make a tight coil from a quarter length of green 3mm paper and glue the end. Gently push the centre out to make a cup shape and put a little glue inside to make sure it does not push in again. Glue these two parts together to make a bud. I have lightly brushed a dark pink felt tipped pen over the top of the flower and bud to just colour the very edges.

Fold 20cm of green 1.5mm paper in half, glue along the inside faces and press flat. Cut to length for each flower stalk, then cut the end at an angle.



Make two leaves using a quarter length of 1.5mm green for each. Make a loose coil and pinch one end to shape the leaf.

Arrange the quilled pieces on the card and glue into place, add punched dots to the corners of the white panel.

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
