

Wedding Wishes

Materials Required:

Paper: White and Pale Green.

White Stardream Paper 14cm x 19cm.

5mm Quilling Paper: Red and White.

3mm Quilling Paper: Red, White and Pale Green.

6mm White Ribbon Approx. 30cm.

Tracing Paper and Pencil.

Lettering: XL667U-02 and XL603U-02.

Leaf Punch.

Tweezers and Scissors.

Quilling Tool.

P.V.A. Craft Adhesive.

Card Mount: SF01M-82 Stardream Silver.

To Make The Card:

Trace the horseshoe shape from the diagram, you can add a tiny mark at the point of each heart to help with positioning them later. Transfer the horseshoe and heart marks to the white paper and cut out the horseshoe. This will be used as a base for the quilled shapes.

For the hearts use 3mm paper as follows. Cut 36 x 2cm and 7 x 1.5cm strips of red. Cut 36 x 2cm

and 7 x 1.5cm strips of white. Fold in half and wind each end into the centre to form the heart. The smaller ones

are used around the lower inside curve where it is more of a squeeze.

Make a little puddle of P.V.A. on some scrap paper, pick up a white heart with the tweezers, dip in the glue and stick to the horseshoe, this should be with the point inwards and starting at the left 'arm' on the top right corner, the curves of the heart should be just level with the edge of



the paper horseshoe. Add a red heart to the left of this one, then add a white at a bit of an angle to get around the corner.

Continue working all the way around the shape alternating the colours as you go and keeping the curves of the hearts to the edge of the paper. Use the slightly smaller hearts where necessary as you work around the curve of the horseshoe.

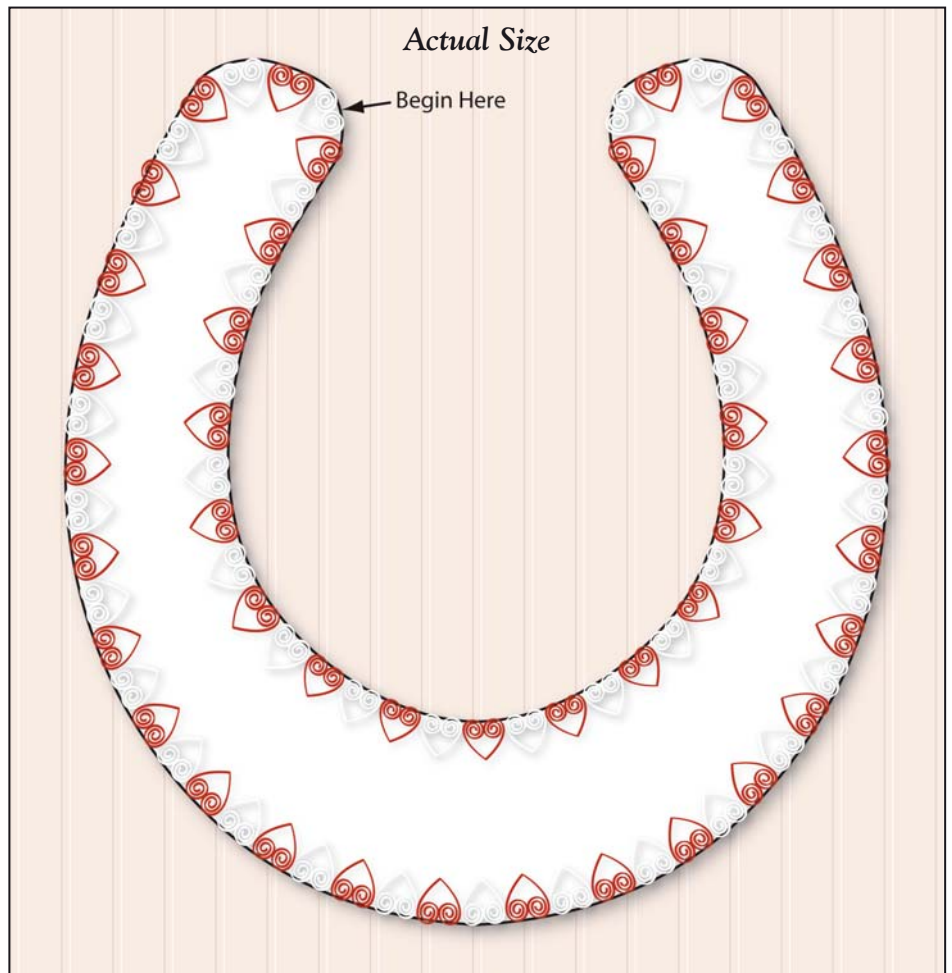
Make 8 red and 8 white roses using full lengths of 5mm paper, see diagram on facing page. Place one end of the paper in the quilling tool and wind round for 4 or 5 turns then fold the quilling paper down at a right angle. Wind round a little further bringing the paper back up to horizontal as you do so. Fold the paper down again and repeat until the rose looks a good size, cut off any excess paper and glue the end.

Punch 18 leaves from the pale green paper and glue one behind each of the roses. Place two red roses at the bottom of the horseshoe one either side of centre, glue into place and glue the extra leaves under and towards the centre. Position the other roses up each side beginning with a white then a red etc. Once you have them evenly spaced, remove each one in turn and glue into place.

Make 6 more red and 6 more white roses in the same way as before. Make 2 more each of the red and white roses but stop when they measure just 6 to 7mm in diameter.

Punch 4 green leaves from the light green paper and glue one in each corner of the white pearl panel placing the top leaf to the corner in each case. Glue a red rose to the top left and bottom right corners over the leaf and a white rose in the opposite two corners. Glue a pair of contrasting roses by each of these corner roses.

Cut a 3cm length of green quilling paper and curve to a gentle 's' shape, glue the top between the roses in the top left corner so the length flows down the side. Make a mirror image on the top right corner. Cut a single leaf from a punched set and glue to the bottom of one of the small roses, repeat for the other three. Glue



these beside the flowing lengths, 2 each side placing a red then a white on the left corner and a white then a red on the right.

Roll a tight peg from a 5cm length of red and one from white and glue the red one at the end of the flowing stem on the left and the white on the right side.

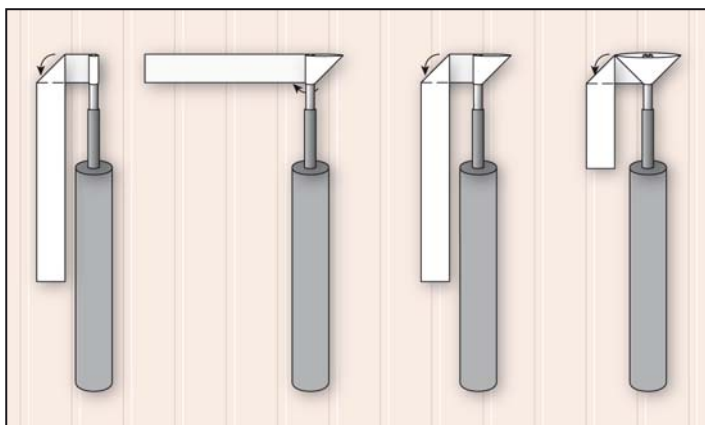
Cut 2 x 2cm lengths of green paper, roll each end to form a scroll shape and glue these along the top edge of the panel beside the rose on each side.

Make 4 more of these scrolls and glue either side of the bottom rose clusters.

Cut the white ribbon in half, glue one half to each side of the horseshoe and tie the two to make a nice bow. Glue the bow to the card panel by the knot so the horseshoe hangs free.



Use the lettering stickers to add a message of your choice in the centre of the horseshoe and then glue the whole panel centrally onto the card mount.
